CHAPTER III

Grants

Writing a grant proposal for educational purposes is a multi-step process. The first and foremost step is to identify the institution from which you want to apply for the grant. Some institutions fund individual teachers and organizations, while others fund only one or the other. It is important to check the guidelines of the grant you are applying for. All states have a variety of grant opportunities available for schools that would like to promote literacy or implement a PBIS, SEL, or DEI system.

Grant Opportunities



Details Matter

Funders expect grantees to have a plan, explaining Bookworm benefits for students.

Good: Ask for a book vending machine for your elementary school.

Better: Stating you need the vending machine for PBIS rewards

Best: The Book Vending Machine will improve reading comprehension throughout the student body as they prepare for middle and high school.

Funders don't just pay for a project; they also pay for innovation, ideas, and results.

Additionally, it is important to have a feasible project with a reasonable timeline (typically about a month to a year).

Promising that the whole student body will ace their standardized tests is not feasible.

However, stating that you wish to improve test score averages, behavioral shifts, attendance and participation is more realistic and measurable.

Stay Updated

Keeping up-to-date with available grant programs is vital. There are multiple sites that offer education grants and info. If you need help finding and writing a grant proposal, we recommend checking out these resources.

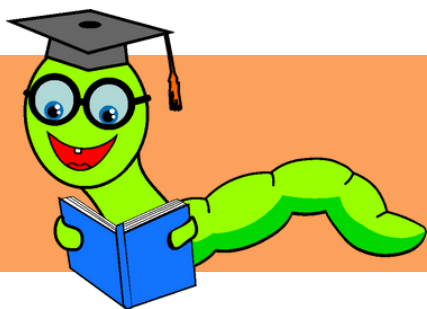
